Ready Phase

RESIDENTS ADVISED TO BE READY FOR THE POTENTIAL THREAT OF HURRICANE DORIAN

The City of Aventura is closely monitoring the movement of Hurricane Dorian and encourages Aventura residents to monitor the progress of the storm over the next few days. As of now, South Florida is in the forecast track, and Aventura must prepare for any potential impact. Timelines can change, so it is important to stay tuned to the local media outlets for the latest hurricane updates.

Public information bulletins like this one will be issued and available to update the community at cityofaventura.com.

Plan and Prepare

Residents are encouraged to implement their hurricane plans and preparations.

City & County Services

With the exception of a few facilities closures, all city and county services are currently operational. Keep in mind that many services cease when tropical storm force winds arrive in an area. Should service interruption announcements be necessary, the City will formally announce those in a succeeding Public Information Bulletin.

Closures

The City's Founders Park, Peace Park, Veterans Park, Waterways Park, Waterways Dog Park, and the gymnasium at the Community Recreation Center (CRC) are currently closed for storm preparations. The CRC will close on Friday, August 30th at 6:00 p.m.

The Aventura City of Excellence School and Don Soffer Aventura High School follow the same schedule and direction of Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Other schools and government office closures are announced through the local media.

Evacuation

Residents are to monitor local media and be prepared for possible evacuation announcements as well as shelter information. Please be advised that Aventura is mostly a level D Storm Surge Zone with a small portion in level B (located north and south of the Lehman Causeway, east of NE 34th Avenue and south of the Miami-Dade/Broward County line) and level C (located south of NE 183rd Street to NE 176th Street, the City's southern boundary).
